HARC hopes that by providing a support forum for breeders and offering HARC race sponsorships, we will not only encourage owners and breeders of 'Heritage' Arabians to join the grassroots of our sport and broaden the base of Arabian racing worldwide, but will also help to preserve valuable bloodlines which can continue the heritage of their ancestors. HARC does not want to cause animosity we just want to preserve something we all believe is important for the Arabian horse and we thank His Highness Sheikh Sultan bin Zayed Al Nahyan for having faith to take up this initiative.

Definition of a HARC horse:

"In order to preserve the classic characteristics of the purebred Arabian horse, it has been agreed that a HARC (Heritage Arabian Racing Club) horse is any purebred Arabian registered in any WAHO accepted stud book and it must NOT contain the blood of the following stallions in any generation of its pedigree. Stallions excluded: Amer, Baroud III, Burning Sand, Dragon, St Laurent, Tiwaiq."
